The Selective Licensing Scheme

Birmingham City Council (BCC) have released information about how the scheme works, with further details still to be announced.

What is Selective Licensing?

A selective licensing scheme means that all private landlords in a designated area must have a licence to rent out their property. The aim of the scheme is to improve the private rented market.



How to obtain a license

Birmingham City Council are due to confirm details on the process but have advised that applications will be made through their website or on a new app.

The following is what you will need to apply for a selective licence:

- Name and contact details of anyone with an interest in the property this could include the owner, freeholder or mortgage company
- Licence applicant's date of birth
- Property floor plan with room measurements their position in the property
- Current electricity installation inspection and test certificate
- Most recent gas safety certificate (if applicable)
- A debit or credit card to pay the licence fee

How much will a license cost?

Each licence will cost £700 per property and will last for five years.

What happens if a property does not have a licence?

Birmingham City Council may take action which could include taking you to court if your property does not have a licence.
